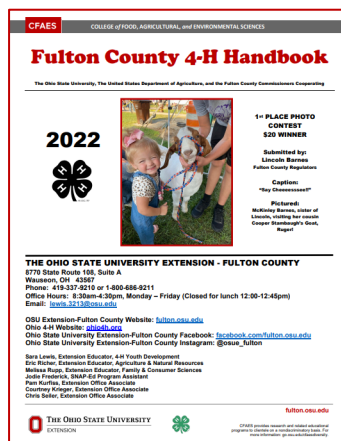

4-H ENROLLMENT IS LIVE!

4-H ENROLLMENT FOR 2022 IS OPEN

Are you a volunteer and know you are going to be active in 2022? Do you already know a 4-H project that you plan to take in 2022? Go ahead and GET YOUR ENROLLMENT COMPLETED! 4-H enrollment is completed through 4-HOnline (v2.4honline.com). In order to be eligible for competition/awards and to be allowed to sell a market animal through the “donation” sale, enrollment must be completed by **April 1, 2022 11:59pm**. All projects may be dropped through June 1, 2022.

FFA members ONLY will enroll and select projects via an online survey at go.osu.edu/fultonffa with guidance and support from their FFA Advisor.

****Important notes for returning members/families/volunteers** DO NOT CREATE A NEW ACCOUNT!!** You will use the same log-in credentials as were used during the 2021 enrollment process. In the event that you cannot recall your password, enter your current family email and click the “Reset Password” button and proceed following given instructions. Please contact the OSU Extension office if you no longer use or have access to the family email account used to set up your registration so we can get the information updated. You can add projects to your registration until April 1, but cannot delete them once submitted. If you need to drop a project (before June 1), you will need to contact Pam (419-337-9210 or Kurfiss.1@osu.edu).

Please make sure that your contact information (phone, address, email) is correct. You have the ability to log back into your 4-Honline account and update your information throughout the year. We will use the information in your profile as the primary means of communication, particularly via emails, for information, updates, and other 4-H happenings.

As before, Club Advisors will have access to view club member enrollments and information once their profiles are active. Advisors cannot reactivate their account without enrolling (and completing your background check if it's your year to do so). If you have any 4-Honline or enrollment questions, please contact Pam.

HOW TO SUPPORT YOUTH NEEDING ACCOMMODATIONS

The Ohio 4-H and Fulton County 4-H programs provide quality educational programs accessible to all Ohio youth. The 4-H program is for everyone and is striving “To Make the Best Better.”

The Winning 4-H Plan, similar to the school-based IEP process (but less paperwork), allows parents/guardians to help set realistic goals for their special needs child through appropriate 4-H activities. Winning 4-H Plans help the club, county, and state 4-H programs arrange accommodations that will help the 4-H youth and 4-H family have a positive 4-H youth development education experience.

The Fulton County OSU Extension Office encourages parent/guardians to work with your club advisor to develop a Winning 4-H Plan for your 4-H youth if you believe it would enhance the youth's experience in the Fulton County 4-H program. The Winning 4-H Plan is signed by all parties, youth, parent/guardians, club advisor, and 4-H Extension Educator, signifying agreement upon the requested accommodations.

You may find the request form for the 4-H Winning Plan on the Fulton County OSU Extension website [here](#). There is no due date for this, but we'd encourage you to get this form by **April 1, 2022**, so we can have the proper accommodations for them.

ACROSS COUNTY LINES REQUEST FORM

Youth who do not reside in Fulton County and wish to join Fulton County 4-H must complete an [Across County Lines Request Form](#). This form only needs to be completed **once** (unless a 4-H member moves counties or schools). If you have a youth who is joining your club and does not reside in Fulton County, please have them fill out and return this form by **March 15, 2022**. *Please note: this is a *REQUEST* and does not confirm the youth's membership into 4-H until both the 4-H Educator in the resident county and Fulton County 4-H Educator, Sara, approve the request.



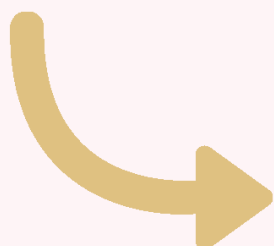

Additional neighboring county dates and info can be found at go.osu.edu/nwohqa2022. All of these sessions will be accepted as QA certification, some are in-person, some are virtual. IF YOU ATTEND QA OUT-OF-COUNTY, IT IS THE EXHIBITOR'S RESPONSIBILITY TO HAVE THEIR CERTIFICATE TURNED IN NO LATER THAN JUNE 1, 2022 TO THE FULTON COUNTY OSU EXTENSION OFFICE.

QA requirements can also be completed through your community club, if eligible.

Quality Assurance – It is MANDATORY for ALL Fulton County Junior Fair animal exhibitors (including breeding animals) to attend Quality Assurance class each year. If you do not attend a QA session, you are ineligible to exhibit at the Fulton County Fair. This is a mandate of the Fulton County 4-H Council. The Ohio Department of Agriculture minimum standards are in-person instruction on three pre-determined Good Production Practices with an interactive activity. The instruction is to last at minimum one hour and is to be repeated annually. QA classes are listed below. If you intend to complete QA at a state 4-H livestock clinic, check with the Fulton County 4-H Educator if it will qualify for QA credit in the county. **Mandatory** sessions are for new and returning 4-H/FFA animal project members wanting to exhibit any animal at the fair.

All 4-H Quality Assurance trainings must be completed by June 1st. Quality Assurance Sessions will only be held at club meetings if a club advisor received QA Assistant Instructor Certification by completing training for the current year.

Horse QA will be conducted online through EquiSTEP, by each individual exhibitor, in accordance with Ohio Horse 4-H curriculum. **Horse QA only allows youth to show horses at the fair. It will not certify you for other fair animals. June 1st deadline.**

Dog project members have two options to certify for quality assurance. 1) attend one of the Quality Assurance Sessions listed above; 2) view the videos shown at the annual Dog Kick Off event; or 3) check out and view "Safety Around Dogs" video. **Dog Quality Assurance only allows for youth to show dogs at the fair. It will not certify you for other fair animals. June 1st deadline.**

REMINDER: Quality assurance is not required for youth taking pet care projects such as guinea pigs, cats, mice, gerbils, hamsters, rats, chinchillas, ferrets, hedgehogs, and pet rabbits. These animals do not exhibit at the fair.

For youth ages 13+. Applications are available at fulton.osu.edu under 4-H Youth Development, Older Youth Opportunity Base Application PLUS Royalty additional page application. If not already submitted, applications are due **April 1, 2022**. Interviews are Tuesday, May 24, 6:00pm at the Fulton County OSU Extension Office. You will be called to set up an interview time by May 15.

All youth will complete a 4-H/species knowledge test on-site using Edulastic 30% total score. Written tests are available in place of Edulastic if advanced request is made. 30% total score written application. 40% total score interview.

- **4-H King and Queen** (\$250 scholarship each)
- **4-H Species Ambassadors:** Lamb, Goat, Dog, Poultry, and Rabbit (\$200 scholarship each, one male and/or female ambassador per species)
- **4-H Horse King and Queen:** Specialized application. Test to be concurrently completed with interview times on May 24, 6:00pm at the Fulton County OSU Extension Office.

Other Fulton County Royalty

- **Junior Fair King and Queen:** Interview date and time to be announced by Junior Fair Board (August).
- **Commodity Royalty:** Pork Queen (June), Beef Queen (August 1), and Dairy Ambassador (early February). Please directly contact the commodity groups for specific information about their royalty contests.

SCHOLARSHIPS DUE IN APRIL & MAY

FULTON COUNTY PORK PRODUCERS, DAIRY ASSOCIATION, and CATTLE FEEDERS SCHOLARSHIPS

The Fulton County Pork Producers (upped to a \$500 scholarship, due April 1), Fulton County Dairy Association (\$1000 minimum scholarship, due April 30), and Fulton County Cattle Feeders (\$500 minimum scholarship, due May 1) offer scholarships to eligible youth pursuing advanced degrees from 2 and 4 year institutions in agriculturally related fields. At the discretion of the Association Boards, multiple scholarships may be awarded in a given year. Application forms for each group list more information on eligibility requirements and are available at the OSU Extension Office and online.

OHIO STATE FAIR SCHOLARSHIPS

Scholarships ranging from \$750-\$3000 dollars are provided by various endowment scholarship funds are available to youth who participate in Ohio State Fair activities. Competition for these scholarships is generally limited. Youth are encouraged, but not required, to have participated in state fair events in the past year. Applications are available online at <https://ohiostatefair.com/scholarships/> and are to be submitted by April 15.

COUNTY FARM BUREAU SCHOLARSHIP

A \$500 scholarship is given annually to a current year Fulton County high school graduate who has applied, been accepted to, and plans to attend a college or technical school in the fall. Youth majoring in agriculture, home economics, and science areas will have first preference but all applications will be reviewed. Youth must be a son or daughter of a current Fulton County Farm Bureau Member. The award will be distributed after the first term of college is complete with a minimum 2.25 GPA. Youth must fill out an application at <https://ofbf.org/2022/01/13/2022-county-farm-bureau-scholarship/> which is due April 1.

CHRISTOPHER T. NORMAN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

This is a \$500 scholarship for current 4-H members and current year graduating high school seniors in Ashland, Defiance, Erie, Fulton, Henry, Huron, Lorain, Lucas, Ottawa, Richland, Sandusky, Seneca, Williams, and Wood counties. It is a memorial scholarship for Christopher T. Norman who was a 4-H member and had a long career in Farm Bureau with the aforementioned counties. Applicants must apply, be accepted, and attend a college or technical school in the fall. Preference is given to Ohio State University (including ATI and branch campuses) students. Applications are available at the Fulton County OSU Extension office and are to be mailed by April 13.

GENERAL INFO

Participation in the Fulton County Junior Fair exhibits and shows is voluntary. It is the expectation of the Livestock Sale Committee and Fulton County Senior Fair Directors that youth exhibit their own animals. Off-grounds events are not considered special circumstances.

BLUE RIBBON ONLINE ENTRY FORMS

Junior Fair Entries are due by August 1 and are required via "Blue Ribbon Online" for ALL ANIMALS to exhibit at the Fulton County Junior Fair. The web portal will be open for registration from July 1, 2022 at 12:00am– August 1, 2022 at 11:59pm (EST). LATE ENTRIES ONLY ACCEPTED UNTIL AUGUST 5 BY 4:30PM AT THE EXTENSION OFFICE BY WITH A \$20 LATE FEE. The online link and instructions will be available at go.osu.edu/FultonJrFair. These instructions will assist you in completing your on-line entry. Please read and follow the instructions before entering your online entry. There is information included in these instructions to assist you through the process and make sure everything is entered correctly. There is one set of instructions for "individuals" and one for "Group" (2 youth or more).

JUNIOR FAIR SALE ANIMAL DESIGNATION

Sale animal designation for the Junior Fair Livestock (Donation) Sale is made in the Blue Ribbon Online entry, which is required for all animals exhibited at fair. This includes all 4-H/FFA members taking a steer, feeder calf, Gallon of Milk, market rabbit, turkey, "Pen of Three" broilers, market lamb, market goat, or market hog project. Designations will not be allowed after the entry form deadline. Changes are only permitted if the animal is chosen as Grand/Reserve Champion, if the animal dies at the fair, or if the animal doesn't come to the fair.



JUNIOR FAIR NEWS

OHIO DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE (ODA) RULES

All animals coming into Ohio from Michigan have health requirements. For a copy of the Ohio State Regulations on Health Requirements Governing the Admission of Animals or other information on current animal health regulations, contact DVM-Chief, Division of Animal Industry, Ohio Dept. of Agriculture, 8995 East Main St., Reynoldsburg, Ohio 43068. Ph: 614-728-6220 or 1-800-282-1955. For mandatory ODA rules on exhibiting animals see <http://codes.ohio.gov/oac/901-19-31> through code 901-19-39. Copies are also available at the OSU Extension Office.

FEEDER CALVES - Possession date - June 1st; Mandatory Identification Day - June 4, 2022, 9 am-12pm. Dairy Feeder Calves must be 100% dairy. They will be inspected at the Identification Day on June 4. Crossbreeds will show as a beef feeder calf.

2022 Fulton County Jr. Fair 4-H & FFA Feeder Calf Vaccinations

Required shots for feeder calves to be shown at the Fulton County Fair. Pick up medication and a form from Northwest Veterinary Hospital. The form must be filled out, signed by the person administering the vaccine, and presented at the gate with your animal on the day of check in. MARKET HOGS - Possession date, June 1. Hog ID Day June 4, from 9am—12 noon at the Fulton County Fairgrounds. Market hogs will be a split show of barrow and gilts. With the split show at the Fulton County Junior Fair, an exhibitor can bring 1 or 2 hogs to the fair: a) 1 gilt; b) 1 barrow; c) 1 barrow and 1 gilt; d) 2 barrows; e) 2 gilts BUT only one hog can go through the donation sale, the other would go directly to the truck for market support only. Please enroll your market hog as project #139.

RABBITS - Possession date, June 1 for Breeding Rabbit and Roasters. Fryer project does must be in possession by June 1. All MARKET FRYERS & ROASTERS and BREED rabbits must have a permanent and legible tattoo in the rabbit's left ear before checking in at the fair. Tattoo Days are open to all. Cost is free to Junior Fair exhibitors, \$1 per rabbit for others.

- **Mandatory** Roaster Tattoo Day - June 4, 8:00am-11:00am. | **Mandatory** Market Rabbit Fryer Tattoo Day - August 6, 8:00am—10:00am (must bring mother doe along) | Both Tattoo Days will be in the Rabbit Barn at the Fairgrounds. You may have a friend, 4-H advisor, family member etc. bring your rabbit for this tattoo/ID. The 4-H member does NOT have to be present.
- There is a permanent tattoo kit available to check out at the Extension Office for non-market rabbits only.
- Please note: Pet rabbits do not go to the Fair.

GOATS - Possession date, June 1. Goat Tattoo Day - June 4, 9:00am - 12:00 noon at the Fulton County Fairgrounds, North end of Goat Barn - Market goats will be tattooed and it will be recorded, requirement to participate in the Fulton County Junior Fair Show and Sale. Goats will sell on Thursday.

POULTRY - Pre order market turkeys and market chickens (broilers). Market turkeys should be in possession week of April 24 and market broilers should be in possession week of July 17.

Junior Fair Poultry Show Clarifications: The following 4-H poultry projects are not eligible for Junior Fair market/breed classes, but could be exhibited in the Fulton County Fair Open Class (enroll utilizing the Fulton County Fair Handbook) and exhibited in Junior Fair Showmanship: 150 DM - Market Duck and 150 TE - Fancy Turkey. 150 H - Helmeted Guinea Fowl will show as a fancy poultry project. A Pair of ducks exhibit is a breeding pair (1 male, 1 female).

Geese are not permitted to exhibit at the Fulton County Fair in 2022.

Market turkey suggested weight is 25—50 lbs. There is no longer a maximum weight of 35 lbs.

Pullorum testing IS REQUIRED FOR FAIR POULTRY in 2022! Pullorum testing for chickens will take place on August 6, 2022 8:00am-10:00am on the Fulton County Fairgrounds-South End of Rabbit/Poultry Barn. Pullorum testing for turkeys must be done by a licensed vet (with subsequent fees). See Section 14 of Fulton County 4-H Handbook for more details.

DOGS - Dog Crates will be required at the Fun Show and at the Junior Fair Dog Show for dog and handler health and safety concerns. – In the event an exhibitor fails to produce a crate for their dog at either of these events, the exhibitor and their dog will be dismissed from the show. A completed Ohio 4-H Dog Vaccination/ID form is required to show at the Fulton County Junior Fair Show.

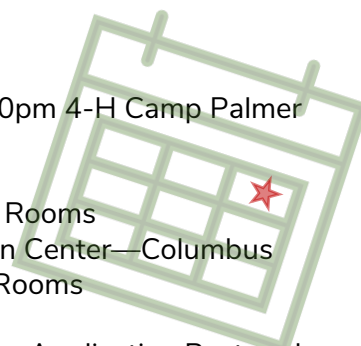
